General Information

The Vocational Nursing Program requires 12 months of full-time study or 24 months part-time. Upon completion of this 51 unit program, the graduate is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-PN) for licensure as a Vocational Nurse in the state of California. Each Fall semester, 30-60 candidates are accepted into the full-time program and 30 into the part-time program. Those applicants who are not accepted may reapply the following year. There is no waiting list. For dates of pre-nursing workshops, please call (951) 222-8405.

Minimum Requirements for Eligibility

NOTE: Meeting minimum criteria for the program does not guarantee admission to the program.

1. The following must be met prior to the application deadlines. Please check with the Counseling Department to verify official high school and college transcripts are on file.
 - a. Admission to Riverside Community College.
 - b. Graduation from an accredited high school or equivalent (G.E.D., High School Proficiency Examination, Associate degree or Bachelor's degree). Official up-to-date transcripts required.
 - c. A cumulative grade point average of at least a 2.0 ("C") in all college course work attempted.
 - d. Application to the VN Program submitted during the application period. Applications are obtained from and submitted to the Transfer and Career Center during the application filing period. Students who wish to start the program in the fall must submit an application regardless of whether or not they have completed Nursing 50 and/or Anatomy and Physiology 10. **Note: No waiting list is maintained.** Therefore, a new application is necessary each year.
2. The following must be met in order to be considered for admission to the program.
 - a. Anatomy and Physiology 10 or equivalent.
 - b. Nursing 50: offered at Riverside City Campus only. There may be a waiting list. Check with the Nursing Enrollment Technician in LS 203.
 - c. 100% on Nursing Program Arithmetic Proficiency Exam. Exam will be administered concurrent with Nursing 50.
 - d. Be at least 17 years of age (Section 2866a, VN Practice Act).

Transcript Requirements

***Transcripts are "Official"** when they are sent directly to RCC from the sending institution, or are hand-delivered by the student in a sealed envelope from the sending institution. Copies of transcripts/diplomas not accepted.

****Transcripts are "Up-to-date"** when they are received by RCC no more than 90 days after the sending institution issued them, as verified by the date that the institution stamps on the transcript. If you need to request an official copy of your transcripts from other colleges previously attended, a Transcript Request form is available in the Transfer Career Center.

Transcripts that are not official and not up-to-date will be returned to the student. Please be aware that your transcripts will be purged after one year if you have never been enrolled at RCC, or if you have not been an RCC student for four years.

Admission will be denied to an applicant who earned a grade of "C-" or less in a Vocational Nursing Program at another college.

Application Period:

FALL: First semester - January 2 through February 2.

SPRING: Second semester - September 1st through October 1st. (For advanced placement VN students only)

Health Exam and CPR Certification

Students who have been awarded space in the VN Program will be required to submit the following: (1) CPR (BLS Healthcare Provider Course) certification valid for one year, (2) Completed health examination and immunization form.

Background Check

Effective Spring 2005, all new and readmitting students will be required to demonstrate a clear background check prior to enrollment in clinical courses. The process for obtaining the background check is available in the Nursing Education office.

California Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians: Legal Limitation of Licensure (BVNPTE, 24 November 1984)

Students applying to take the vocational nursing licensure examination are required to submit fingerprints and report convictions of any offenses other than minor traffic violations; failure to report such convictions would be grounds for denial of license. Citizenship and Immigration Status Verification Required for VN/RN Licensure

The Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act requires government agencies to eliminate "public benefits" to individuals who cannot provide proof of their legal status in the United States. "Public benefit" has been interpreted to include a license issued by a state. This means that all applicants for licensure as vocational/registered nurses will be required to submit verification of citizenship or legal residence status in the United States. A license will not be issued until legal status in the United States has been confirmed by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. This will be implemented no later than January 1999.

Disclosure of Social Security Number or FEIN

If you fail to disclose your social security number or your FEIN (Federal Employer Identification Number), your application for initial or renewal license will not be processed.

Fingerprint Requirement

One requirement to qualify for the licensing examination is the submission of two fingerprint cards. These cards are evaluated by the California Department of Justice and the F.B.I.

Point System

Applicants are awarded space in the program on the basis of ranking according to the following point system. (Total points possible = 130).

Qualified Application

5 POINTS POSSIBLE

Five points ONCE ONLY will be given to applicants who met all of the admission criteria by the application deadline.

RCC Residency

5 POINTS POSSIBLE

Five points will be given to applicants having previously attended RCC for one full semester within the two years preceding the semester in which they apply.

District Residency:

5 POINTS POSSIBLE

Five points will be given to applicants residing within the RCC District.

Students wishing to complete an Associate in Science Degree may do so by completing the requirements for the certificate, plus completion of the graduation requirements as described in the catalog, totaling a minimum of 60 units of college work as required for the A. S. degree.
