### **Associated Students of Riverside Community College District**

**(ASRCCD)**—Riverside Community College has one of the most active multi-campus student government programs in the country. The main purpose of student government is to provide student leaders with skills beyond what they learn in the classroom. Interpersonal communication, budget control, entrepreneurial skills, creativity and event planning are just a few of the skills that our very active student leaders will learn. The student government is comprised of three main branches of government. The Executive Cabinet is headed by the ASRCCD Trustee, who is elected by student vote in the spring of each year. This branch includes the Presidents and Vice Presidents of Riverside, Moreno Valley, and Norco campuses who are also elected by their respective campuses, and the ASRCC District Senate Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary. The Legislative Branch consists of Senators who are elected-at large each year from all three campuses. The Senate initiates legislation and approves budgets, expenditures and appointments of officers. The Judicial Branch consists of a number of Associate Justices who are appointed by the Trustee and each campus President, subject to Senate confirmation. The Supreme Court rules on the constitutionality of legislation, conducts student elections, and is responsible for holding student forums.

**Board of Commissioners (BOC)** —The purpose of this organization is to provide different events and activities for the different aspects of the student body. This organization meets Mondays 10:40-11:40 in the Heritage room.

**Inter-Club Council (ICC)** — The purpose of this organization is to foster communication between clubs, to promote cooperation and organization between the clubs, to promote joint participation in each other's activities and to provide support for clubs in respect to any financial assistance or grievances when presenting such matters to the Riverside ASB Senate. This organization meets Mondays 12:40-1:40 in the Heritage room.

**PROCEDURES FOR FORMING  
STUDENT CLUBS OR ORGANIZATIONS  
AT RIVERSIDE COMMUNITY COLLEGE,  
RIVERSIDE CAMPUS**

**STEPS IN FORMING A NEW CLUB OR ORGANIZATION:**

1. A full-time faculty member must agree to sponsor a specific club/organization and agree to be present at club/organization functions, meetings, and events. Occasionally, two faculty members can agree to cosponsor a club/organization and share the responsibilities. Student organizers need to obtain an "Agreement to Sponsor form" from the Student Activities Office and submit it to the designated Coordinator of Student Activities. When completed, the proposed sponsor's name will be forwarded to the President of the college (or his designee) for approval of appointment to club/organization sponsorship.
2. Student organizers need to provide a list of no less than seven (7) prospective club members (rosters available in Student Activities Office) and submit it to the designated Coordinator of Student Activities. Co-curricular organizations must submit a list of their members each semester to the Student Activities Office (form available in Student Activities Office). In order to be a club/organization member, each student must be an active cardholding member of ASRCCD.
3. Student organizers need to write a club constitution (an example form available in Student Activities Office) and submit **two typed** copies to the designated Coordinator of Student Activities.
4. When the Coordinator of Student Activities has received and approved the following forms, the information will be submitted to the Dean of Student Services and the ASRCC Riverside Campus Senate for final approval.
  - a. Application for Recognition as an RCC Campus Club/Organization
  - b. Agreement to Sponsor Form for Club/Organization
  - c. Club Roster Form or Co-curricular Organization Participation List
  - d. Club Constitution
  - e. Copy of Facilities Request for club meeting

All campus clubs and organizations are operated under the administrative supervision of the Riverside Campus Dean of Student Services and are sponsored by the Associated Students of Riverside Community College District.
