

GET INVOLVED!

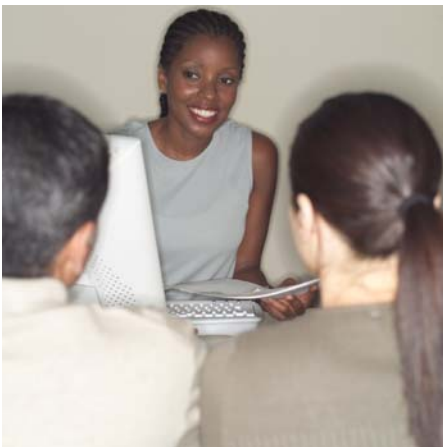

A full-time faculty member must agree to sponsor a specific club/organization, and agree to be present at club/organization functions, meetings and events.

- Obtain an "Application for Recognition", "Agreement to sponsor Form", and a membership roster listing no less than seven prospective club members (Forms available in Student Activities Center) and submit to the coordinator of Student Activities on the Moreno Valley Campus.

- Each Club member must pay the appropriate student services fee.

When the Coordinator of Student Activities has received and approved the appropriate forms, the information will be submitted to the Dean of Student Services and the Moreno Valley Campus Student Senate for final approval. All forms are available in the Student Activities Center.



Student Activities Mission Statement:

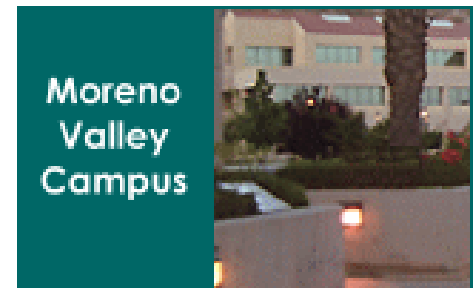
