THE MAJOR:

Anthropologists study the world's varied peoples and their cultures. They want to know how and why the variety arose. They also seek the similarities we all share - our human nature. Social and cultural anthropologists study living peoples in all aspects of their lives - economic and technological, social, political, aesthetic, religious, and so on. Social anthropologists emphasize the importance of social arrangements as determiners of differences and similarities. Cultural anthropologists emphasize culture, consisting of the customary thinking and feeling patterns with the world and themselves. Archaeologists are mainly the anthropologists of the peoples no longer living; they excavate and interpret earlier cultures and societies from their material remains. Linguistic, biological, and psychological anthropologists specialize in particular bodies of information and certain methods, but all of them are still concerned with differences. The breadth of this subject makes it exceptionally valuable as liberal education preparation for a profession or for life; however, graduate work to at least the master's level is important in securing most employment in the field.
