THE MAJOR:

Criminal Justice is the study of the causes, consequences and control of crime. Like other new and developing fields, criminal justice is difficult to define as it draws from a number of different

disciplines...psychology, public administration, philosophy, sociology and law. Programs leading to the Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice are designed to acquaint preservice and inservice students with the principles and practices of criminal justice in America. Although the curriculum allows for the development of depth in one of the subject's substantive sub-systems (i.e. law enforcement, courts or corrections), the overriding objective is to familiarize students with activities in all the above areas.
