- II. Approval of the minutes from May – m/s/c Kelly Brautigam/Jude Whitton, approved, 1 abstention
- III. Welcome to RAC’s new ASRCC reps—Riccardo Miconi and Jesus Madrigal
- IV. Reports
 - EPOC – no report
 - GEM-Q – developing draft Mission Vision Value statements, discussed program review reports, and accreditation mid-term report

 - Co-curricular Assessment
 - TRIO -Cecilia Lusk– All three grants sections are full, contact Cecilia for more info or if you have students who are interested. TRIO recently

hosted a field trip of 30 students to CSUSB for a tour and admissions presentation, they connected with the TRIO program at CSUSB. After the tour, they visited Cheech Museum.

- Cal Works – Anne Lennox- the numbers for fall are increasing, currently have 160 students. They are busy with new student orientation, they give out school supplies every term. The County of Riverside pays for childcare and text books, full time students get \$500, part time students get \$250 added to their EBT cards. They are working on follow up counseling right now, students who take advantage get a \$50 gas card. They are collecting Halloween costumes for costume swap. If you would like to donate contact Anne.

V. Ongoing Business

- Equity in Assessment: Brandon Owashi's crash course in data coaching – The Data Coaching program is going to be revamped to potentially accommodate a larger cohort for a one-year duration instead of two. The goal is to increase data literacy, increase access to data, make data informed decisions, and create better communication surrounding and supported by data. Brandon gave an overview of the program, and shared a case study to discuss in breakout groups. The groups reconvened and discussed their outcomes.

VI. New Business

- Election of RAC chairs— the Senate bylaws required a process for electing new chairs. Jude shared proposed revisions made to the senate bylaws regarding the Assessment Committee. Committee members discussed the length of service for the co-chairs, and decided to propose a 3-year cycle.
- December RAC meeting idea – suggested sharing best practices for assessing SLOs/PLOs at various stations in the room, open the meeting up to the wider college to participate for FLEX credit.
