4. Land Acknowledgement
 - a. Rosales read aloud the Land Acknowledgment sent by Dr. Keene: We at Riverside City College offer gratitude and respect to the original and current caretakers of this land, water, and air: the Tongva (Gabrieleno), Cahuilla, Payómkawichum (Luiseño), and Serrano peoples and all their Ancestors, Elders, and descendants of the past, present, and future. We recognize that this meeting place is home to many Indigenous peoples from all over the world, including RCC students, classified professionals, and faculty. We show gratitude for the opportunity to live and work on these homelands and take responsibility to be good stewards of this place.
5. Ongoing business / Discussion
 - a. Joint Leadership Prioritization Letter - 2022
 - i. Rosales mentioned that the prioritization letter was sent out by Dr. DiMemmo for information purposes.
 - b. Prioritization 2022 - Reflections & Suggestions
 - i. Members reflected on the prioritization process and offered feedback for improving on this process in the future. Recommendations include: clarifying the process and all steps for members; clarifying who are voting members; emphasizing the importance of each step of the process including the final meeting in which members vote on final prioritization; clarifying details about faculty hires and departmental needs; offering more sessions for Q&A leading up to prioritization; potentially having a back-up member of the committee to represent a voting member; changing the day/time of the last meeting to account for members

teaching times; splitting the LC meeting to allow for voting to take place during the already scheduled meeting

6. New Business

a. Parenting Centers & Support

- i. Dr. Calderon is working with Annie Lennox on current goals. There is currently no way to collect data, so Dr. Calderon will work with Wendy to find a way to collect data. There has been a healthy turnout at past Student-Parent club sponsored events. Suggestions were offered regarding potential improvements to campus and policies to support student parents on campus including: more daycare opportunities such as drop-in, short term day care; more lactation pods; offering activities that incorporate students and children to offer a more welcoming environment; internships with ECE to help staff a Parent Resource Center. SAS will continue to work with the Student Parent club, and will support these efforts by first bringing these suggestions to EPOC.
