





Our Task

What will it take...

1. To reach the college goal of 1,000 more students per year on a signed pathways contract over the next 3 years?
2. To give these students free tuition and books so long as they meet the requirements of the contract?
3. To position the college to competitively apply for forthcoming college promise grants and the Governor's Innovation Award grants to aid in this effort?
4. To sustain the program at a stable rate (3,000 students per year) and even if grant funding is not available?

- ▣ What will be the proportion of 1 year remedial to 2 year transfer/certificate contracts? What is the right balance?
- ▣ What should be the minimum GPA/requirements for maintaining eligibility?
- ▣ Do we target only incoming students or also students already here?
- ▣ Other.....????

Resources

Assembly Bill No. 1741

This bill would establish the California College Promise Innovation Grant Program, under the administration of the Office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, which would require the chancellor's office to distribute grants, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the governing boards of community college districts, who meet certain requirements, to support the establishment of regional programs with the goals of increasing college preparation, college access, and college success. These provisions would be repealed on January 1, 2021.
