CIS-910	Introduction to Canvas: Essentials for Online Learning	<i>This course is the first of three in a series leading to a non-credit certificate. It has been developed to help students become proficient in navigating and utilizing the platform's features effectively. As Canvas is widely used for managing course materials, assignments, and course navigation, a foundational understanding is essential for academic success. Courses originally held at November 13 meeting because college committee wanted to ask for more info from originator (primarily why it is a three-course series); held again at December 9 meeting with repeated request for originator to join committee. Ongoing concern about three course series with additional concern that content divisions were even more a concern now given that there are DE addenda for the courses on the agenda; material in the third seems necessary for students in the first course if taking online. Second recommendation to re-organize.</i>	R
