This course doesn't fit into any music degree or certificate and the MVC music faculty have no interest in offering it in the future (as it serves no curricular or supporting role within the music program). It is an elective component within the Associate of Science Degree and Certificate of Achievement for Early Childhood Education. However, the ECE at MVC also have no interest in offering it and are planning to complete a program modification to remove this course from their certificate. Therefore, MUS-1 should be excluded from the catalog.</i>	M

These courses have not been offered in that time, or if attempted to be offered by discipline faculty they were cancelled for low enrollment.
