 - i. Update on Curricunet FSA Clean-Up
 - 1. We have a temporary fix for negatively impacted disciplines. Please notify curriculum chair or curriculum coordinator to help with solution.
 - 2. Can a curriculum rep be added as a contributor to a course they don't have a FSA in? Yes. As long as the discipline expert wants them added, they can set it up.
 - 3. If there is an ongoing conflict within your discipline/department please reach out to Curriculum chair with details so we can address those issues.

 Discussions on future phases are in discussion. Current intention is to expand past phase III:

"The CCC Chancellor's Office CCN Council is engaged in extended discussions about future CCN template development phases and sustainability of the project. Phases I-III were intended as initial

implementation phases so the work is not done. There will be Phases IV+ to further build an inventory of commonly numbered courses as expected by AB 1111 (2021 Berman) and needed by students.

Determining how many courses will be commonly numbered and what the criteria will be for whether a course is commonly numbered are important parts of this conversation. In recognition that curriculum is never static, sustainability conversations include considerations for continued template development processes and for regular CCN template review cycles. Development of an updated Common Course Numbering Project Strategic Plan, including goals and strategies, will continue into the early fall. Once finalized, it will be available on the CCC Chancellor's Office CCN Project webpage and will guide CCN efforts in 2025-2026 and beyond."

- h. SAAM Change Ideas and Updates
 - i. Updates from Committee from your Departments regarding staggered/accelerated CCN Phase IIB/SAAM changes
 - 1. CNA was only able to get min number not max. Was able to get their courses in by this year's deadline.
 - 2. HCA course required 500 minimum hours, so they had to increase the hours/units.
 - 3. NVN one course they can't do anything about. There is no adjustment that meets the regulations.
 - 4. Many departments are looking to launch in spring to lessen the impact in fall.
 - 5. Question about increasing units and the impact to students and financial aid. If they lessen the hours how does it impact faculty load.
 - a. This is faculty responsibility as it impacts how the course is taught.
 - b. If adding hours/units there typically needs to be content increase to explain (which in some limited cases may be expanding on what is being done programmatically but not captured in COR)
 - 6. Dance courses will be done in winter/spring.
 - 7. Curriculum is approx. half of the 10+1 and is faculty responsibility.
 - ii. District is indicating course should be updated to be solid units with no overhang since overhang won't be funded by the states anymore but are leaving it to discipline experts (faculty) to determine what the best solution is for their courses. Those discussions should happen at the discipline level about what is best for the pedagogy for that class; but, to address question about impacts beyond teaching, may also result in questions by discipline for Deans/Chairs/Admins about scheduling grid or program implications or union regarding load changes that impact faculty negatively to maintain course structure.
