Discussion of ETS courses on the agenda: ETS-1, 3, 7, 8 were denied for Area 6 for CalGETC; Denial allows for a 2 year phase out where it will still apply to the area, and ETS faculty can revise the course, re-submit and get approved based on changes. This major modification strengthens ETS 3 in response to reviewer feedback and ensures alignment with Area 6 Ethnic Studies requirements. Greater clarity has been added to the course description, objectives, and content to highlight how students are introduced to the field of African American/Black Studies. The revised description explicitly situates the course within the interdisciplinary origins of the discipline, names foundational frameworks such as Afrocentricity and intersectionality, and incorporates key scholars (e.g., W.E.B. Du Bois, Angela Davis, Kimberlé Crenshaw) and movements that define the field. Course objectives and content have been expanded with specific examples from readings, ensuring clear mapping to Ethnic Studies Core Competencies, particularly those emphasizing resistance, self-determination, intersectionality, and social transformation. College-level assignments have been updated to include a clarified community engagement component, with examples of guest speakers, organizations, and community-based opportunities. This adjustment makes explicit the connection between African American Studies and praxis, while providing students with concrete ways to bridge theory and community engagement. Overall, these modifications provide stronger transparency for students and instructors, create clear pathways for assessing student learning, and underscore the discipline's intellectual and activist

The proposed major modification to ETS 7: Women of Color in the United States is necessary to address reviewer feedback and ensure alignment with both Area 6 Ethnic Studies and Area 3B Humanities requirements. Feedback indicated that the course description and content did not sufficiently highlight the diversity of Women of Color's perspectives, nor did it demonstrate a clear emphasis on the analysis of philosophical, historical, literary, aesthetic, religious, and cultural works. To strengthen the course's alignment with Area 6 Ethnic Studies, the revised description and content explicitly name and integrate diverse women's traditions and movements across American Indian/Native American, Chicana/o/x or Latina/o/x, African American, and Asian American Studies. This change ensures specificity regarding the struggles, histories, and contributions of Women of Color, while also foregrounding womanist perspectives as foundational to the discipline. Furthermore, the modification maps community engagement assignments—such as oral histories, case studies, and collaborative projects—directly to the analysis of these traditions, clarifying the applied and experiential dimensions of student learning. To meet the expectations of Area 3B Humanities, the revised course description incorporates explicit reference to philosophical, historical, literary, aesthetic, religious, and cultural works created by Women of Color. This language ensures that students are not only introduced to theoretical frameworks and historical struggles but are also encouraged to critically analyze and appreciate works of cultural and intellectual significance. Emphasis on critical reading and writing skills, along with assignments such as research papers, multimedia projects, and textual analysis, reinforce the course's grounding in humanities approaches. In sum, the modification is needed to more clearly articulate the breadth and depth of Women of Color's contributions, to reinforce the integration of womanist and intersectional frameworks, and to demonstrate the course's dual alignment with the Ethnic Studies and Humanities GE areas. These revisions respond directly to feedback, strengthen curricular coherence, and ensure that the course meets transfer and GE approval standards.
