  - a. Curriculum Chair – Kelly Douglass
    - i. October 26 curriculum regional information
      1. The Chancellor’s Office chose the six most enrolled classes (1 million students affected) because the legislature is putting a lot of pressure to show progress on bill. AB1111 compels CCC to have common numbering; it doesn’t compel UC or CSU to accept templates for articulation or work with CCC on the same timeline that the bill demands numbering project follow
      2. Erik Reese: please get on the DIG or FDRG groups to have a long term say in the most important elements of courses in your discipline.
    - ii. CCN template formation process
      1. Courses that have a C-ID: the CCN template is being built from those C-IDs. Your survey responses have to be aware of that relationship.
      2. C-ID is the minimal common elements – it’s a base. To add significantly more is forcing a change across the system without a lot of faculty input; this doesn’t mean you shouldn’t add to the existing descriptor as it becomes the template; it is just the context to keep in mind
    - iii. CCN template post-survey information
      1. Post-surveys for group 1 classes (ENG, HIS, ECO, AHS) are Nov. 13-Dec. 4 – they will need to go out to discipline
      2. Advise discipline faculty to look for email from Douglass, Scott-Coe, curriculum rep, [or their department chair] for future post-surveys.
        - a. Phase II, Group 2 (BIO, CHE, MAT, AST) is meeting November 18, 19, 20, 21; post-survey window unknown at time of meeting and minutes.

## Flexible instruction

- Reaching our underserved populations
- Meeting CCC Chancellor's Vision 2030 goal
- Non-traditional/Non-Carnegie model
  - Focus is on mastery and demonstration of skills, not on time
  - Courses deconstructed into fundamental components
    - For chemistry, making a solution, identifying an unknown, calculating a limiting reagent
  - Students take the time they need to become competent in each area
  - Students submit work when they're ready to submit work
  - 80% mastery is necessary to pass each component and be considered "Competent"
  - When all components have been mastered, only then will students get credit for traditional course
    - Haven't quite figured out how to give traditional grades
    - Have hired consultants to help with grading issue
  - There can be in person components

- Automotive technology at X college does this
- Students can submit videos of themselves doing things

**Substantiative changes to:**

- Financial Aid
- Business Services
- Technology

**Other Notes:**

- Radical changes in education that may cause discomfort for some
- CBE will be/is approved by ACCJC and Dept. Of Education

## Competency-Based Education (CBE)

- A **competency** is the capability to apply or use a set of related knowledge, skills, abilities, and intellectual behaviors required to successfully perform tasks in a defined setting.
- **Competency-Based Education** combines an intentional and transparent approach to curricular design with an academic model in which the **time it takes to demonstrate competencies varies** and the **expectations about learning are held constant**.

# How is CBE different from Credit-hour Instruction?

Traditional Credit-hour	Competency Based Education
Coursework (usually 3 units)	Student works on competencies (smaller portions of learning – think of our SLO's for our classes)
Time is fixed; learning is variable (A, B, C, D, F, W)	Learning is fixed ("Mastery"); time is variable
Instruction may be in-person, online, hybrid, synchronous, or asynchronous	Instructional materials are available in LMS; instructor is a facilitator of learning (still providing Regular and Substantive Interaction)
Instructor sets deadlines	Student sets the pace of learning
Final Exam may or may not be summative	CBE Direct Assessment: authentic, summative assessment requires student to integrate and demonstrate knowledge, skills, and abilities

## FIRST COLUMN

"Curricular Module" – CO term for a "container" of a cluster of competencies

## SECOND COLUMN

"Competencies" – each competency will have a definitive summative assessment and will be entered on the competency transcript.

## THIRD COLUMN

Credit equivalent course that will go on the traditional transcript once the student masters ALL the crosswalked competencies.

# Direct Assessment CBE

- **Traditional:** Final grade based on cumulative score from a variety of assignments.
  - Possible to do poorly on one part and well on another
  - Possible to utilize a grade of C (and sometimes a D) toward program requirements
- **Direct Assessment CBE:** mastery is based on one summative assessment for each competency.
  - Learning materials/activities and formative assessments are used to develop KSA so student can demonstrate mastery on the summative assessment
  - Must master all content to the level of 80% (a "B")
  - Summative assessment is authentic to the competency (what is an "authentic assessment" will vary by discipline)



## Shasta College Operations Decisions (cont.)

- **Canvas:** hired Instructional Designer to support faculty building competencies and orientation
- **Policies:** incorporating DA CBE variations into regular policies (e.g., grading, repetition, etc)
- **Faculty Load:** Fall 2025 faculty reassigned time to gauge actual workload, then CBE load will be negotiated
- **Initial Staffing:** part of ECE faculty's load, part of classified student services load, part of Counselor's load
- **Operating Budget:** apportionment based on *completed credit equivalent units*
- **Lawnmowers:** no changes



# Workgroup Goals

- Create general education competency statements that
  - represent knowledge, skills, and abilities associated with general education at the lower division, associate level
  - are defensible as valid performance indicators that describe what students can do after a general education course of study
  - address all general education areas of Cal-GETC
  - create options for colleges interested in DACBE
  - facilitate transfer of equivalent units for students who complete direct assessment, competency-based programs and elect to continue their education

# Overview of Common Course Numbering

- AB 1111 (Berman, 2021): student-facing common course numbering in CCCs for general education and transfer pathway courses
- AB 1111 Common Course Numbering Task Force - recommendations
- Vision of system-level articulation from CCCs to universities using CCN Course Templates
  - Common transferability
  - Common GE applicability
  - Consistent course-to-course articulation
  - Potential for more consistent major prep articulation
- Collaboration of intersegmental discipline faculty necessary to achieve intended student impacts



# Aligned Themes for CCN (AB 1111) & Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act of 2021 (AB 928)

- Transfer focus—simplify and increase transfer rates
- Reduce excess units
- Reduce repetition of courses after transfer



# Impact on Articulation

- CCN Task Force Report: CCN is an opportunity for a new vision of articulation and intersegmental collaboration
- Vision: articulation of CCN Course Template for consistent GE approvals and articulation across all CA community colleges
  - General education
  - Course-to-course
  - Major
  - Monthly system-level conversations occurring
  - CSU, UC policies and processes will need to change



# Impacts & Implications: Acknowledge the Tensions

- CCN requires a shift from complete COR college autonomy to a degree of intentional alignment and similarity needed for system-level articulation needed for students
- NOT common curriculum
- Academic freedom in local COR, faculty syllabi and approach to teaching each class
- Vision depends on UC and CSU changes to current articulation processes
- Fear of losing current articulations
- Frustration and feasibility concerns with technology systems
- Lack of alignment between semester and quarter college curriculum, particularly for sequences
- Local curriculum & catalog processes are already impacted by Cal-GETC, ADT, GE, and AB 1705 changes and more
- There will be implementation impacts on people, technology, local processes
- There is still a lot of uncertainty

- Provides for 1000 courses at each level per discipline per identifier type.
- Other levels could be defined at the system level as needs are identified.
- Major articulations would be indicated locally at colleges via catalog, class schedule, etc.

A system-level key could define options: (examples)  
H = Honors Course  
L = Lab Only Course  
S = Support Course

- Up to 2 specialty identifiers can be attached to a course
- A course with no identifiers would not have fillers in those fields.

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# CCN Template Development—Phase II



## Phase I Template Development: Lessons Learned

- HUGE effort to coordinate, especially on short timelines. Sustainable?
- Additional time needed for dissemination of communication and recruitment of CSU, UC faculty
- Time is needed for updating of CSU, UC policies and practices, including for GE review and articulation
- Phase 1 is 1<sup>st</sup> attempt; improvements to template contents needed
- Articulation officers are critical to the conversation



# Faculty Engagement in CCN Course Templates

- Surveys: Soliciting Faculty Input from CCCs, CSUs, UCs, independent colleges
  - Phase 1 informed by 1,014 responses
  - Phase 2: Group 1 650 responses, Group 2 >1000 responses
- Faculty Participation in Convenings
  - Phase 1 large- and small-group convenings: About 550 intersegmental discipline experts, with over 45 support personnel (facilitators, AOs, ASCCC and system representatives)
  - Phase 2: 13 discipline-specific CCN Faculty Workgroups being convened Fall 2024, each with 12 intersegmental faculty reps, AOs, and ASCCC facilitators
- Starting points are C-ID descriptors, developed by CCC and CSU faculty.
- Articulation officers are critical!
- Post-Surveys: Review of developed templates by intersegmental faculty



## Phase II: CCN Course Template Development

- Approx 20 high-enrolled courses, additional Cal-GETC areas, at least one sequence

- You don't need to label "Part 1" and "Part 2" but it is recommended that the identical info be noted in some way to assist with future revisions and to ensure the info remains identical

- You do not need to add or revise existing fields in your curriculum management system to incorporate Part 1 and Part 2!
- Use what you have for now
- Wait until we have more information from Phase 1 and future phase implementations before updating systems
