 - i. No report
- h. Equity
 - i. Very little to report regarding the Student Equity Committee. We have not met yet this semester. We are currently adjusting to Dr. Moore's recently announced and pending resignation.
 - ii. The SEC co-chairs are currently planning an open session for this Wednesday to discuss the proposals for reorganizing the committee. We then plan to meet on April 7th for our first formal meeting with all members.
- i. OER (Open Education Resources)
 - i. Faculty mentors for each division have been selected. They are currently being processed so that each division will have a faculty mentor to explore OER and learn about free/low cost resources.
 - ii. Heather will be sending out the names of the mentors for the divisions.
- VII. New Business
 - a. Interim Faculty co-chair voting – Gregory Russell was elected by the faculty members of TLLC
 - i. 8 faculty members voted by secret ballot – 7 votes for G Russell, 1 abstention.
 - b. Discussion of topics/actions for next meeting
 - i. How many have sat with Brandon Owashi regarding your department's equity? Could we invite him to a TLLC meeting to discuss data driven equity?
 - ii. What can we do to address the groups having the most need? How do faculty use the data to make the most improvements to those who need it most?
 - iii. Data shows there are many engagements with students from classified professionals. These interactions happen before students even enter the classroom.
 - iv. Classified professionals need to be included in the conversations. Classified professionals are also educators at the community college.
 - v. How to stay aware of how the data can be used to make the biggest impact. There is much to learn from the classified professionals.

- a. Student Co-chair Jake England – ASRCC will be holding Easter Egg hunt in the quad; ASRCC is also holding senate elections soon, applications are open now and available to all students, especially those looking for leadership opportunities.
