01 Budget Hearing Presentations

[Discussion/Informational]

Members of the budget committee will hear the presentations of entities coming before the ASRCC Budget asking for allocations for the FY 25/26 academic year. Entities submitted their budget requests and supporting documents by April 23, 2025 and were scheduled an individual time to present before the committee. Entities are provided 15 mins each, unless otherwise noted in the schedule. The committee is limited to asking questions related to the budget presentation and the rational for the budget expenditures. The committee is not to make any determinations of amounts until deliberations. (SCHEDULE ATTACHED)

- I. Guitar Ensemble Organization
 - a. Throughout the academic year, has been able to bring in various guest composers/artists to RCC
 - i. Attending and preforming at LA Guitar Festival
 - ii. Utilizes funds for tools, equipment and instruments for students
 - 1. Pieces can be found online or is performed live
 - b. Budgets
 - i. Festival Competition \$6,000
 - ii. Recording/Touring \$13,000
 - iii. Equipment Cost \$8,000
 - iv. Guest Artist Concerts \$15,000
 - c. Questions
 - i. Are the 'guest artists' considered as guest lecturers? Senator Glenn

- 1. The artists provide Master Classes and concerts that provided entification and entertainment for the Riverside Community
- ii. Are the artists available to the whole RCC community?And how do you spread the word of these events? -Senate Finance Jackson
 - 1. Yes it's open to all students currently attending RCC; advertising is done through social media, posters, etc.
- iii. Is it possible to expand advertising to make folks more aware? Senate Finance Jackson
 - Yes, we will work on submitting requests earlier to Printing & Graphix so they can create things on time
- iv. What types of community outreach does the program do?Senator Glenn
 - 1. There are various events that incentives younger folks to preform and improve their musical talents hosted by Guitar Ensemble
- v. How much of your budget have you spent? Senator Bishop
 - 1. Guitar Ensemble is projected to use all the funds by the end of the Fiscal Year of 2024-25
- vi. What is the importance of the equipment budget? Senator Glenn
 - 1. Quality equipment is required for students to learn and grow; lower quality equipment will only produce poorly trained students; cheaper guitars can still be utilized by beginners

- vii. How does Guitar Ensemble gain funding outside of ASRCC? Senator Graves
 - 1. There is a donation from an engineering firm that they have been able to obtain
- viii. How long does the guitars typically last? Ex. Officio ASRCC President Solis
 - 1. It is very dependent on care, wear/tear, usage, etc.
 - ix. Does the Guitar Ensemble want to also perform at the main RCC campus? - Special Events Council Director Caloca
 - 1. Yes, there have been a few events held at RCC but we would like to hold more

II. RCC Athletic Trainers

- a. This organization is a great opportunity for students to drive into Sports Medicine
 - i. Has approximately 40 students per semester
 - ii. Works towards prevention, recognition, treatment and rehabilitation
 - iii. Has various professional requirements for students interested in participating in the program
 - iv. There is 2-year's worth of classes available for folks to participate in while in the program, while also motivating folks for 'Transfer Readiness'

b. Budgets - \$9,231

- i. Professional Seminar in Sports Medicine
 - 1. To help expenses students to what being in the field entails with the meals, attendance paid for
- ii. Professional Attire
- iii. Pathway in Sports Medicine

1. A seminar open to all students which allows someone to become more knowledgeable in the various opportunities outside of sports medicine, especially for folks who are taking these courses to understand what they would like to do in the future

c. Questions

- i. What is your specific job here at RCC? Senate Finance
 Jackson
 - 1. Regardless of our fields and professions, we would like to provide folks with an all-round understanding of various expertise
- ii. Why are switching the funding request for hosting vs attending seminars? - Senator Graves
 - 1. Mainly because hosting a seminar is far cheaper than attending one; especially with ensuring students are paid for
- iii. How else do you find funding outside of ASRCC? -Senator Graves
 - 1. They are exploring alternative ways/opportunities to better understand, but currently there is no specific answer as they are searching
- iv. Noticed there has been no request for 'advertising,' will the Athletic Trainers Program advertise more? - Senator Bishop
 - Works backwards by looking at local high schools for folks interested in the program; does advertise via social media

III. Art Club

- a. An open club that is focused on art, specifically in illustration and animation
 - i. There is currently seventy (70) members, with thirty to forty (30-40) active members as of this semester

b. Budgets

- i. Chalk Walk \$800
 - 1. General equipment, food, water, and sunscreen; with \$200 contributed from Trust Account
- ii. Back to School Chalk Walk \$800
 - Mainly occurs in the fall that either welcomes back folks or introduce new students to the Club, expecting to have a turnout of 50 students; \$200 will be contributed form Trust Account
- iii. Guest Artists \$1,800
 - Expose, inspire and educate attendees about the pathways of art, 6 guest speakers per Academic Year
- iv. Animation Showcase \$1,250
 - 1. A great opportunity for attendees to see showcases from animators; \$200 will be contributed from the Trust Account
- v. Field Trips \$600
 - 1. Allows students to be inspired by others' artworks
- c. Questions
 - i. How much money are you hoping to reallocate? Treasurer Dominquez
 - 1. The money has been allocated to the desired accounts in the Fiscal Request
 - ii. How does the Art Club obtain funding outside of ASRCC?
 - Senator Graves

1. Through the Trust Account and through students selling their artworks

IV. Dance Department

- a. Everything given from ASRCC is allocated to students through equipements, props, dress, etc. for all students at RCC
- b. Budgets
 - i. Celebrating Dance Concert \$4,000
 - 1. A mixture of a Festival and Seminar that students can attend with various workshops and utilization of personal skills
 - ii. Summer Showcase \$-
 - iii. American College Dance Association Conference \$4,250
 - 1. A maximum of twelve (12) students are taken to the Baja branch to attend a Festival that improves their skills, leadership and work
 - iv. High School Dance Day \$1,500
 - 1. Usually happens around Spring Break with an upwards of two-hundred (200) students to become aquatinted with various aspects of Dance
 - v. Ballet Ensemble (Dance Outreach Ensemble) \$3,000
 - vi. Kinetic Conversations \$3,000
 - vii. Motion Co (RCC Hip Hop Company) \$4,000
 - 1. This will be a team that represents RCC to allow students to participate in and showcase

- i. Does other Departments also collaborate with Dance? Ex. Officio ASRCC President Solis
 - Not necessarily, but students do work with Dance to help aid

- ii. Is Dance involved with the choreography of the Landis Theater? - Senate Finance Jackson
 - 1. No, Theater does utilize their own choreographer
 - 2. Dance is hoping to expand advertising operations
- V. Theater/Musical Theater Department
 - a. Looking to do two (2) full productions this upcoming Fiscal Year
 - b. Always participating in ASRCC events such as Halloween Town, Bunny Hop, Club Rush, etc.; much of the funds goes to the 'musical' aspect to help pay students and conductors
 - c. Budgets \$18,000
 - i. \$9,000 per show, casting thirty plus (30+) students
 - ii. Broadway Disney helps to introduce students to the audition process at Disney

Students from the Musical Theater shared their experiences and impacts, being able to participate in this program, as well as the importance of funding Theater overall

 - 1. These are two different line item, it is onlt specific to the Training Room to ensure it does not double dips with Athletics
- ii. So to clarifiy its not the same request as the Training Room Supplies request for the Athletics Admins? - Vice President Carbajal
 - 1. Yes, this is a seperate funding request outside of the Fiscal Request which is strictly \$5,000

Senator Graves requests that the Athletic Trainers find a way to obtain sponsorships through the Community, which can help to long-term partnerships with businesses

Senator Glenn discusses with one of the presenters about a need for the District to better back and fund the Athletics Trainers, rather than forcing ASRCC to fully support and back Athletics as a whole

Ex. Officio Advisor Dr. Bottoms explains that it is in the best interest of ASRCC to help aid the Athletics Department and Programs to prepare a 'preventative' plan rather than 'reactive' plan that can be more costly
