
Riverside City College



California Community Colleges are now offering Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT's) to the CSU. These may include Associate in Arts (AA-T) or Associate in Science (AS-T) degrees. These degrees are designed to provide a clear pathway to a CSU major and baccalaureate degree. California Community College students who are awarded an AA-T or AS-T degree are guaranteed admission with junior standing somewhere in the CSU system and given priority admission consideration to their local CSU campus or to a program that is deemed similar to their community college major. This priority does not guarantee admission to specific majors or campuses. Students who have been awarded an AA-T or AS-T are able to complete their remaining requirements for the 120-unit baccalaureate degree within 60 semester or 90 quarter units. Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer Degree

The Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer Degree provides a general preparation for Kinesiology majors to be able to enter any four-year university. Students completing the Associate Degree for Transfer in Kinesiology will be prepared to transfer to a CSU and pursue a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology. In this major, students will enhance physical skills and development in the areas of Aquatics, Combatives, Team Sports, Individual Sports, Fitness and Dance. Students will also be exposed to the history and philosophy of Kinesiology. This degree will satisfy the lower division requirements for the eventual conferral of the Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology at CSU. With this degree the student will be prepared for transfer to the university upper division level. Additionally, the intent of an ADT is to assist students in seamlessly transferring to a CSU.

Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer Degree

The Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer degree will be awarded upon completion of 60 California State University (CSU) transferable units including the above major requirements and the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) OR the California State University General Education (CSUGE) requirements with a minimum grade point average of 2.0. All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
