Riverside City College and University of Phoenix are excited to announce the opportunity to enroll in the Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (ADN)/ Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program, offered by University of Phoenix. Through this opportunity, Concurrent Enrollment participants are eligible to **save 20% on the cost of tuition**. This Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) is created for nursing students to obtain an Associate in Science Degree in Nursing (ADN) while completing coursework towards the Bachelor of Science (BSN) in Nursing.

- CEP students will be enrolled in Riverside City College and University of Phoenix programs at the same time. However, courses are not taken concurrently.
- Students who complete the first 4 blocks of the Riverside City College Nursing program and concurrent University of Phoenix courses will complete the BSN degree within a shorter timeframe.
- The University of Phoenix Concurrent Enrollment Program is an educational partnership designed to assist in meeting the Institute of Medicine 2010 Future of Nursing goal to increase the percentage of BSN RNs to 80% in California by 2020.
