Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)

This history path prepares you to be a skilled researcher, an analytical thinker, and a keen observer of the human condition. There are many careers where these skills are useful. Among these are: marketing and advertising, community outreach, social services, political campaigns, civil service, administration and management, human resources, program planning, professional writer, editor. Completion of the Associate Degree in History for Transfer (ADT) will prepare you to meet minimum lower division admission requirements (60 transferable units) for transfer to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC). Transfer to the UC may require additional coursework, please meet with a counselor. The History program map below includes your major course work and recommended general education courses by term that is needed to fulfill your degree and transfer requirements.

Which terms are History courses offered?

History courses offered Fall and Spring: His 1, His 2, His 6, His 7, His 25, His 31, His 34.

History courses offered during interim sessions: His 6, His 7. Other courses occasionally offered.

History courses traditionally offered in the Fall: His 11, His 14, His 19, His 28, His 32, His 35, His 44.

History courses traditionally offered in the Spring: His 12, His 15, His 29, His 33, His 42.

History courses offered at least once every two years: His 2H, His 6H, His 7H

Enrollment status will impact the completion time for your degree and/or transfer. Full Time students are recommended to take between 12-15 units per term. Part Time students are encouraged to take between 6-9 units per term (meet with a counselor to determine appropriate work/life/school balance). Program completion is dependent on your schedule availability and when courses are offered.

The courses listed below will fulfill the lower division general education requirements for all CSU campuses.

- A. English Language Communication and Critical Thinking (minimum 9 semester or 12 quarter units) **** Must be completed prior to transfer!**
Select one course from each group. *Grades of 'C' or better are required.*
- A1. Oral Communication:** Communication Studies 1 or 1H,6,9 or 9H ****
A2. Written Communication: English 1A/1AH ****
A3. Critical Thinking: Communication Studies 2,3; English 1B or 1BH; Philosophy 11,32; Reading 4 ****
- B. Scientific Inquiry and Quantitative Reasoning (minimum 9 semester or 12 quarter units) **** Must be completed prior to transfer! Select one course from groups 1, 2 and 4.**
At least one of the science courses must have a lab – see underlined courses.
- B1. Physical Science:** Astronomy 1A,1B; Geography 1 or 1H,1/1L or 1H/1L, 5; Geology 1,1/1L,1B,2,3; Oceanography 1,1/1L; Physical Science 1,5; Physics 10,10/11
B2. Life Science: Anthropology 1 or 1H,1L; Biology 1/1H,5,6,7,8,9,10,14, 14/15, 18(formerly BIO 34),19 (formerly BIO 36),20,45 (formerly AMY 10), Psychology 2;
B3. Laboratory Activity: This requirement may be met by completion of any lab course listed above in areas B-1 or B-2.
All underlined courses will meet this requirement.
B4. Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning (grade of 'C' or better is required): Math 1A,5,12 or 12H,25, Psychology/Sociology 48****
- C. Arts and Humanities (minimum 9 semester or 12 quarter units) Select three courses, with at least one course from "Arts" and one course from "Humanities":**

*Activity courses - **Only 1 unit of activity coursework may be applied towards area E.** Students may complete GUI-48 combined with 1 unit from the approved activity courses listed below in order to fulfill the 3 units required in area E. Military veterans who submit DD214 will be awarded 3 units towards Area E certification.*

Transfer students enter the CSU system with junior standing. If you are admitted to a program deemed similar to your AA-T, you will only need to complete 60 additional semester units (or 90 quarter units) to earn a bachelor's degree and will not be required to repeat courses that are similar to those completed at the community college as part of your associate degree. To stay on schedule, make sure you stay enrolled at your campus, pass all of your classes and follow your education plan.
